Anderson Animal Shelter and Crate Free Illinois Team Up to Teach Kids About Farm Animal Welfare

This summer marks the first year that Anderson Animal Shelter will include educational sessions about farm animals as part of their Youth Humane Education program. Led by the local farm animal welfare nonprofit, Crate Free Illinois, the sessions will be part of the Shelter's summer Critter Camp for children ages 6 – 10.

In addition to learning about responsible pet ownership and the welfare of companion animals, children will also learn why we need to have compassion for animals raised for food. In this 60-minute, child-friendly presentation, Crate Free Illinois volunteers Lisa Schmalz, a high school teacher, and David Ouellette, a college professor, demonstrate how pigs, chickens, and calves are humanely and naturally raised by local farmers.

"As Americans, we shower our pets with love and affection. In Illinois, we have comprehensive laws to protect dogs and cats. But sadly, animals raised for food are frequently exploited and have few laws to protect them," said Jessica Chipkin, founder of Crate Free Illinois. "We're extremely grateful for this opportunity to work with Anderson Animal Shelter and help kids understand that, in the end, there's really no difference between cruelty inflicted on a dog, cat, parakeet, horse, chicken, cow or pig."

Critter Camp is a week-long summer camp program for animal-loving kids. In addition to the educational sessions, campers also engage in arts and crafts, games and hands-on time with shelter animals. Sessions are Monday-Friday, from 9 to 1:00 PM, beginning June 11 and repeated weekly through July 20.
